

Information on Continuing Education Units for NC Infant-Toddler Program (ITP) Trainings

The Infant-Toddler Program (ITP) is partnering with the McKimmon Center for Extension and Continuing Education at NC State University to help you earn Continuing Education Units (CEUs) for the NC ITP required trainings and professional development (PD). The McKimmon Center is the CEU providing agency that you will see on your CEU certificates and transcripts.



Are CEUs and ITP Credit the same?

No. CEUs are Continuing Education Units and are usually required by licensed professionals. Each unit is equal to 10 contact hours of participation in an approved training or professional development program. One contact hour is equal to 60 minutes of interaction between the trainer(s) and trainee(s).

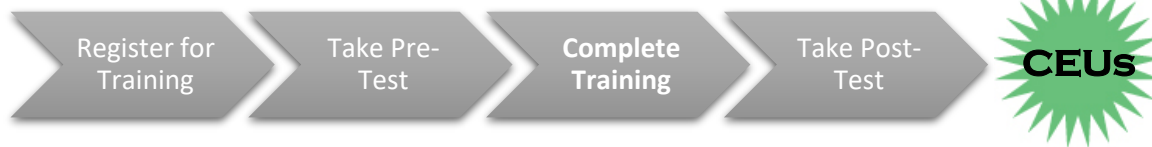
ITP credit is specific to the NC ITP and can be used toward the maintenance of the Infant-Toddler Family Certification (ITFC). Everyone who attends a training is eligible for ITP credit.



How Do I Get CEUs?

To earn CEUs for any eligible NC ITP training or PD, you must first complete the appropriate pre-test on Qualtrics. This information will be given to you one week prior to your training. Once you have completed the training, you will then be sent another link to complete the post-test. Both tests are requirements, as set by the McKimmon Center at NCSU. No CEUs will be provided for trainings/PD occurring in the past.

Within a few weeks after completing the training, you will receive an email from the McKimmon Center, with information on how to access your Official CEU Transcript, for those of you needing that. However, all CEU recipients will receive an NC ITP CEU Certificate.



Who is Eligible for CEUs?

CEUs (Continuing Education Units) will only be provided to those whose positions require them. This may include Speech-Language Pathologists (SLPs), Occupational Therapists (OTs), Physical Therapists (PTs), Licensed Clinical Social Workers (LCSWs), those working with clients who have Hearing Impairments (HI) or Visual Impairments (VI), or those in the health care field (Physicians, Nurses), etc.

If you only have an ITFC to maintain, you only need ITP credit, not CEUs. The information above is also included in each pre/post-test survey on Qualtrics and will filter out those indicating they are “non-licensed staff or providers.”
